

# Checklist: How to Become a Direct Support Professional (DSP) in Ohio

## Minimum Qualifications (for ALL DSPs)

- Must be 18 years or older
- Have a high school diploma or GED
- Be legally eligible to work in the United States
- Have a valid photo ID and Social Security number
- Be able to read, write, and understand English
- Pass a BCII background check (FBI check if lived outside Ohio in past 5 years)

## Required Training (Before Providing Services)

- Complete the 8-hour Initial DSP Training (DODD-approved, online or in-person)
- Get First Aid and CPR certification (must be in-person from approved providers)
- Receive Individual-Specific Training (provided by the care team or agency)

## If You Will Administer Medication (Optional but Common)

- Take Medication Administration Category 1 (oral/topical meds)
- Optional: Category 2 (g-tube) or Category 3 (injectables)
- Complete skills check-off with RN Trainer
- Complete individual-specific med training for each person
- Annual medication certification renewal is required

## Ongoing Compliance (Annual Requirements)

- Complete 8 hours of annual continuing education (includes 2 hours of DODD-required topics)
- Stay current with CPR and First Aid certifications

Maintain compliance with agency or DODD monitoring

### **Additional Requirements to Become an Independent Provider**

Complete the DODD Independent Provider Orientation

Submit Application for Provider Certification through the DODD Provider Portal

Provide required documents:

- Copy of driver's license or state ID
- Copy of Social Security card
- High school diploma or GED
- Proof of First Aid and CPR certification
- Certificate of Initial 8-Hour DSP Training
- Background check (BCII and FBI if needed)
- Current email address for DODD communications
- Completed IRS W-9 form

Submit application fee (\$125, non-refundable)

### **After Certification**

Wait for approval from DODD (30-45 days)

Register for Electronic Visit Verification (EVV) through Sandata

Learn how to submit billing and documentation through eMBS or PCG

Connect with your County Board of Developmental Disabilities for referrals
